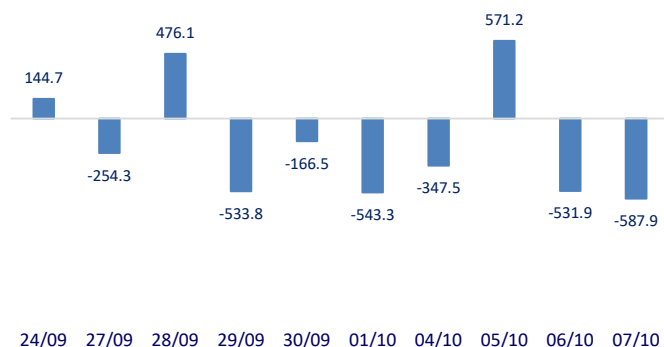

Besides, the bank's total deposits as of the end of September reached VND 230,644 billion, up 24.73% over the same period and exceeding approximately 4% of the whole year plan. By the end of the third quarter, TPBank's capital adequacy ratio (CAR) was recorded at 13.43%, much higher than the minimum level of 8% prescribed by the State Bank.

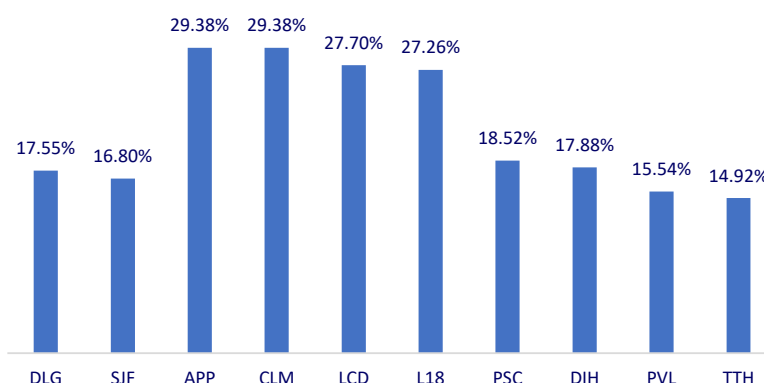
Top most traded tickers (Volume - in million)
